

# Why no cattle abortion or stillbirth should go unexplored



When you encounter cows aborting in your herd, it's critical to manage the situation with care to reduce health risks to other animals and humans, to help inform herd health planning, and to comply with relevant laws and guidelines.

## It is important that every farmer CARES:

- C** Collect placenta and arrange collection and submission of abortion samples for testing.
- A** Assess herd disease status, presence, absence, risk and immunity.
- R** Report promptly to meet the legislation requirements in the four nations.
- E** Ensure protection of the rest of the herd and improved future herd health planning.
- S** Safeguard you, your family, and farm staff from zoonotic disease.
